Wellington City Council has reviewed the design for the National War Memorial Park. The review is additional to the process of Council officer inputs into the development of the design.

This review refers to the *National War Memorial Park (Pukeahu) Empowering Act 2012*, and assesses the proposal against the 'Park Design Principles' in Part 3 of the Act. The overall review of the park is that the design is consistent with the National War Memorial Park Empowering Act 2012 Design Principles.

The proposal is of high quality, relating to its setting, referring to the history of the place and providing spaces and facilities that will be attractive and functional for both events and everyday use.

As per Condition 04, Part 4, Schedule 2 of the National War Memorial Park (Pukeahu) Empowering Act 2012, Wellington City Council certifies, under section 24, that the drawings and specifications submitted for the National War Memorial (Pukeahu) Park on 10 January 2014 are consistent with the Park design principles identified in Part 3.

As the project moves into its construction phase it is imperative that quality, including specification of tolerances, materials, surfaces and elements including their robustness and durability is high, and befitting a National War Memorial. This can be ensured through ongoing designer involvement in this stage of the project.

I look forward to the ongoing partnership between the Memorial Park Alliance and the Council.
