I refer to your requests received on 31 October 2022 for information relating to the National Erebus Memorial, under the Official Information Act 1982.

On 31 October 2022, you requested the following information:

Can you please provide me with the most up to date cost information for the proposed Erebus Memorial as at 31 October 2022.

I would appreciate the costs being broken down as previously into materials, design consultation, technical consultants, consent and operating costs along with the total cost figure.

If you could also please confirm the total amount spent on security, project management and keeping Naylor Love on Standby from 1 October 2022 until 31 October 2022.

I am releasing to you a table showing a breakdown of costs.

The total spend as at 31 October 2022 is \$2,498,885.58 (this is the total costs including those not supplied in the breakdown above).

A breakdown of the project management costs, security costs, and costs to keep the main contractor on standby are being withheld under section 9(2)(b)(ii) of the OIA to protect information where the making available of the information would be likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information. We can supply the total for the 3 services combined.
