There are no additional documents within the scope of your request, other than the information that is being provided to you in previous requests on 16 December 2022 (DOIA22/263 and DOIA22/268) and on 10 February 2023 (DOIA22/289 and DOIA23/004).

3. Can I also please have all costs associated with the memorial to 31 January 2023 as per previous breakdowns [into materials, design consultation, technical consultants, consent, and operating costs along with the total cost figure. If you could also please confirm the total amount spent on security, project management and keeping Naylor Love on Standby from 1 January 2022 until 31 January 2022.]

I am releasing to you a table showing a breakdown of costs.

The total spend as at 31 January 2023 is \$2,743,337.92 (this is the total cost, including costs not supplied in the breakdown above).
