I refer to your request received on 29 April 2023 which has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), for the following information:

Manatū Taonga

The geotechnical survey information upon which the recent decision to cancel the Dove [Myer] Robinson Park Erebus Disaster Memorial was made, and also, any associated reasoning showing how that decision to cancel, was based on the survey (instead of say, altering the memorial to make it work).

On 28 April 2023, Manatū Taonga Ministry for Culture and Heritage announced that significant damage caused at the National Erebus Memorial site by recent extreme and unprecedented weather events in Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland, means a new, enduring home for the memorial needs to be found.

A media release from the Ministry noted that while the proposed National Erebus Memorial will not be placed at Dove Myer Robinson Park, it is committed to securing a home for the National Erebus Memorial.
