

I refer to your request transferred to us on 18 January 2023 from the Ministry for Business Innovation and Employment, which has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), for the following information:

Has the Government commissioned research to establish what the likely real cost would be to change our country's name from New Zealand to Aotearoa? If so, what is the figure?

Following a comprehensive search, we do not hold the information you requested, and we do not believe any other department or agency would hold the information requested.

In searching for relevant information, we contacted Land Information New Zealand and the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) and were advised these agencies also do not hold the information you have requested.

We are therefore refusing your request under section 18(e) of the Official Information Act because the information is not held and does not exist.
